## *A Word from the Director*

### **God's Word is Trustworthy**

As the vicious Coronavirus has everyone's undying attention around the world (no pun intended), the companies that make medical masks are working overtime to meet the heavy demand. Masks had their humble beginning in Leviticus 13:45 where God explained that a person with an infectious disease must "... cover the lower part of his face. . .". People who have caught the Coronavirus are immediately quarantined off from everyone else so as to not spread the highly contagious virus. Quarantine is talked about in the very next verse in Leviticus 13:46, where God says, "As long as he has the infection, he remains unclean. He must live alone; he must live outside the camp." God didn't explain to the children of Israel that there are germs and bacteria, but simply told them to obey his Word and follow His instructions. God's Word has always been true and will always be true. We must follow and live by His Word.

In the early 1800's, Matthew Maury was brought up by parents who lived by God's Word and encouraged their children to memorize the whole book of Psalms. Growing up Psalm 8:8 stood out as a curious statement that was not understandable to Matthew: "the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas." The last part of the verse confounded the young boy because although he could see the sea, he did not see any paths in the seas.

Living along Virginia's coast, Matthew was able to study the meteorological currents of the sea. After analyzing ship's charts for many years, Matthew noticed that ships that sailed from America to Europe through a certain passage tended to travel much faster than ships that sailed outside of this passage. In the late 1840's and early 1850's Maury published several books that outlined his discovery of the Gulf Stream. Today Matthew Maury is known as the "Pathfinder of the seas" and the "Father of Modern Oceanography", all because of Psalm 8:8.

3,000 years ago, God, who knows all things had King David write about the "Paths of the seas," but it took until the 1800's for it to be understood as a young boy memorized Psalm 8 and then sought to find out what God meant by the "Paths of the seas". The Bible is a spiritual Book, but it also speaks accurately about science in dozens of places. This shows that an all-knowing God had to have spoken the Bible to men, otherwise, how could such an ancient book know these scientific truths? Praise God that we can know that God "breathed" His Word and that it is true and trustworthy!
