KBA Fall Celebration October 15th, 2022



The Keystone Baptist Association met on Saturday, October 15th, 2022, at Country and Town Baptist Church for a celebration of 60 years of Kingdom Impact. 18 KBA churches had representation there with 41 messengers, 18 visitors, and 3 staff for a total of 62 in attendance.

Russell and Kristi Johnson provided the music for the celebration. Dr. Don Henrikson led in the business meeting. Rev. Richard Krieg and Rev. Larry Theisen shared a glimpse of KBA history.



Rev. Brad Horne presented his report inspiring pastors and churches to continue moving forward in evangelism, prayer, and fulfilling the Great Commission. Discussing adding additional churches to the association and sharing about a possible new church plant. Pointing out the numerous ministries that KBA is involved in. Outlining the programs that

KBA offer and the opportunities to partner and work together. Reminding that we are better together.

Brad shared his passion on discipleship and encouraging others to find someone to disciple. Saying "We have one Lord and one mission. Success is hearing 'Well done thy good and faithful servant'." Closing with this challenge: "The greatest legacy that we at KBA can have for future generations is that at the 60th anniversary we decided to really make disciples and that made a huge difference."



Rev. Steve Sheldon shared update from BRN and Rev. Kenton Hunt spoke about the impact KBA has had in his life prior to giving a Disaster Relief report.

The KBA Administrative Team was recognized and prayed for as they begin their new terms in office. And, as a gift of appreciation each pastor who was present received a page from a 1613 King James Bible published by Robert Barker in London.



Dr. Don Henrikson, KBA’s moderator, reminded those in attendance that we have been given a legacy, and asked the question, “What are we going to do with it?” Speaking from 2 Timothy, Dr. Henrikson shared the gospel legacy of Paul and Timothy. Stating that we carry on the KBA legacy because the gospel is worth the suffering and as we do it together, we can get the gospel to more places than what we can do separately. Secondly, it is better to suffer together than alone. Summing up his thoughts by sharing the importance of KBA’s 60-year legacy of advancing the kingdom, by churches working together to call people to faith in Jesus Christ. Braving the dangers that come when calling people to Jesus Christ. Being faithful in raising up and training new people to go take the gospel. Celebrating together as we have gone through the ups and downs, and in that cooperation seeing the kingdom of Christ advance where we live.

Pastor Don Henrikson closes with the thought that when we return for our 70th anniversary, “we would have even more reason celebrate that we were faithful in proclaiming the gospel and suffering for the name of Jesus together.”

Two testimonies were given, one by Rev. Ed Roman and the other by Mr. Eric Broadway sharing their hearts about their work in their churches.

After introduction of new Pastors and Staff there was an auction. Dr. Kenny Craig led in the auction. \$358.00 was raised for Henry Dolan fund designated to help church plants.



Rev. Tim Parker closed the meeting with prayer and lunch was provided in Country and Town’s Fellowship Hall.


